Next, Dr. Tamu Lucero, Superintendent of Stamford Public Schools, presented the first **SPEF Leadership in Literacy Award** to Amy Beldotti for her tireless work as Associate Superintendent of Teaching and Learning at Stamford Public Schools. Then, SPEF Board of Directors member Barbara Aronica-Buck presented the second SPEF Leadership in **Literacy Award** to Alice Knapp, CEO of the Ferguson Library, who has dedicated herself to enhancing literacy in the Stamford community. Finally, Elizabeth McKay, Youth Services Supervisor at the Ferguson Library, presented the last SPEF Leadership in Literacy **Award** to Reading is Fundamental (RIF), honoring its long-time partnership with SPEF and its commitment to ensuring all students have access to books and literacy resources. Kristin Shaffer, RIF's Senior Director of Development, accepted the award on RIF's behalf.

Closing out the ceremony, a beautiful rendition of "May a Rainbow Run Beside You" was performed by the Stamford High School Madrigal Singers. After the ceremony, attendees made their way back to the ballroom for light dessert and coffee, and to make their final auction bids.
